AIM

The Mill Lane Community Garden committee are mindful of all the environmental impacts of the activities involved in the provision of a community garden, and seek to minimise any actions that would be detrimental to the environment.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Encourage wildlife and biodiversity by planting a wildlife area with native trees and shrubs; plants and flowers to attract insects, and hedgehog, bee, butterfly and insect homes.
- 2. Productive trees to also provide food for birds and insects etc.
- 3. No use of damaging chemicals for soil enrichment or pest control. Use of environmentally friendly alternatives and companion planting.
- 4. Use recycled or reclaimed **sustainable** materials and source locally, where possible.
- 5. No waste of water.
- 6. No use of compost containing peat.
- 7. Make our own compost.
- 8. Benches and planters to be sourced from recycled materials.

Users of the community garden to be given a copy of the policy and asked for their agreement to adhere to it.

Review of the Policy to be carried out on a six-monthly basis.
